### **School News:**

**New Award System:** Our school has adopted a new Merit Award System.



Positive Behaviour for Learning – Merit Awards



As you can see, teachers will be giving out 3 awards at each fortnightly assembly, with K-2 one week and 3-6 on the alternate week. Our Librarian, Japanese, Music Teachers and other support teachers will be giving out one award each at each weekly assembly. Awards given out will be Bronze Awards in the first instance. With our new system, award levels exist. Once a child has received 5 Bronze Awards they will then go onto the Silver Award Level, then Gold Award Level; receiving 5 Awards at each level until they receive 5 Platinum Awards and a Sapphire Award presented by the Principal.

Children who have already received a lot of awards can bring them in to show so that they can be put on a new level (as whilst our new computer system allows us to record awards received, our records don't date back 6 years for the older children).

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As a result, Merit Awards, Stage Awards and other school awards are worth the equivalent of a Bronze Award. If they have not had the back signed, indicating that a child has received a Principal's Award (previous kind), they can bring them in so that we can add them to our new tally of 'Bronze' Level Awards. All previous-style Principal Awards can be brought to school, to show how many 'Silver' equivalent certificates a child has received. Students in the later grades may find that their next award is a very special one!!



**Before School, After School and Vacation Care:** Enrolments are open for Before and After School Care, and Vacation Care with Holiday Care Australia (HCA).

Before School Care is open 6am – 9am Monday to Friday by appointment. After School Care opens at 2:55pm until 6pm Monday to Friday during Term. We are open for the upcoming school holidays. HCA is only closed on Public Holidays.

**Voluntary School Contributions:** Thank you to the families who have already paid their voluntary school contributions for 2017. Invoices were sent home in Term 1. To date **we have collected \$1854** in contributions. If every child's contribution was paid we would take in **\$18,000!** That would go a long way to supporting the school in purchasing valuable resources for our students.

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**Student Reports:** School reports are being sent home at the end of this term. They will outline the achievements and effort being demonstrated by your child in each subject area at school, their commitment to school values as well as the behaviour demonstrated this semester. The school reports also share the amount of absences had by students, in terms of minutes late to school as well as days absent. These absences may have resulted in some concepts not being grasped as well as they could have by some students. The absent days do not include days out of class for students attending extension programs or extra-curricular activities like representative sport.

The reports will also mention if your child has been receiving additional support from a School Learning Support Officer or our school's Learning Assistance and Support Teacher in literacy, numeracy or social skills programs. Should you have an immediate question about your child's report, please do not hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher. Other discussion about your child's achievements learning needs/improvements may and be discussed at the parent-student-teacher conferences that will be held in Week 2 of Term 3, Tuesday July 25 and Wednesday July 26.

**Mid-Year Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences:** Our mid-year parent-teacher-student conferences will be booked a different way than in the past. Instead of a booking request sheet being sent home with your child's school report, an information slip will be sent home outlining how you can book your interview online. Families who do not have access to the internet will be able to get support in making their booking by calling our Administration Office on (02) 64951266.

**Stewart House Mufti Day:** Thank you to everyone who supported today's Mufti Day. Today is Stewart House Day. Every year around 1,800 public school children attend Stewart House, which is situated next to Curl Curl Beach. Their visits are at no cost to their parents or carers. During their 12 day stay at Stewart House, the students are provided with dental, optical, hearing and medical screening and treatment.

They participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall well-being. As a result, the experience may provide children with a much needed break. They are also inspired to see beyond the present and have real hope if they are going through difficult times.

Each year we are fortunate enough to have one or two of our students accepted to the program. Your donations help brighten up their day and the days of many other children. Thank you.

### **News From Our Support Classes:**

Around the South Coast: The support classes have been working on their daily exercise and set themselves the challenge of completing a running challenge. This program saw the classes run each morning around a 200 metre course to start their day. Each class tallied their results and marked the distance they travelled on a class map of the Far South Coast. The course took the class around different localities in the local area such as Wolumla, Bega, Cobargo, Bermagui and Tathra. To complete the challenge each class needed to run 164 kilometres. This challenge has been successfully completed by all three classes.

**Bug Survey:** The support classes were involved in exploration of bugs. The Bournda Environmental Education Centre came to our classrooms and brought along water samples from local waterways. The classes were responsible for collecting the bugs they found in the samples and then worked on identifying them. These results were tallied and provide information for future audits for comparisons.

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**Master Chef:** With the new kitchens that have been installed the support classes have been working on their cooking skills and this week have made chicken schnitzel. The process saw the students learn about tenderising the chicken and how to crumb them. There were lots of smiling faces when they were able to bite into their freshly cooked burgers.



**Bournda Excursion:** Students from the learning supports classes in Stage 1 went along with Year One to undertake an excursion to the Bournda Environmental Education Centre. It was a great day where students looked for living things and the impact that humans can have on the environment. There was even a bit of sand dune riding.
