Principal's Messages:

Welcome back to Term 3! We have another fun, engaging and educational term in front of us. It will be a busy term with many exciting activities, such as: Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews, Education Week and Open Day, the Recorder Ensemble performance at the Opera House, Book Week and the Book Fair/Parade, School Photos, the Jackson Cup, Zone Athletics and the three performances of our whole-school musical "The Amazing Adventures of SuperStan".

We cannot wait to take part in all of these educational events, together with teaching and learning more in all of our key learning areas. More information about these and other activities are shared in this newsletter, and on the term calendar attached.

Staff Professional Learning: Our staff had a very productive day completing professional learning on the first day of this term (on Monday before the students returned). They completed planning in teams to further develop our great teaching and learning units for this semester.

School News:

Extended Leave Exemption: Parents of students who are absent from school for up to 5 days, whether they be sick or on family leave, need to provide the school with an explanation note either in writing or via our School Stream app **by the week's end**. If a parent wishes for their child to have more leave, or if they are unwell and require more leave, an Extended Leave Application must be completed as to avoid Home School Liaison Officer contact. Extended leave can be applied for when travelling for extended periods, for medical reasons and/or behavioural reasons.

Extended leave for travel/family business may be applied for. An application form must be approved by the Principal and an approval form given by the Principal for this leave to take place. The approval form may be asked for at customs when going on overseas travel. This application form must be accompanied by an itinerary (for overseas travel or domestic flight travel) or statutory declaration (camping holiday or family trip across Australia for example).

Extended leave for medical reasons can be applied for and approved by the Principal. These applications must be accompanied by a letter from your child's doctor.

Extended leave for behaviour support/partial attendance can be applied for with the Principal to the Director of Education. The Director must approve behaviour related partial attendance or leave.

Kinder Orientations and Interviews: Our Kindergarten Orientation Tours and Interviews have gone very well. Acceptance letters for our 2018 Kindergarten classes will be sent out in the coming weeks. If your child has a plan that we are not aware of, the correct application forms and information forms must be collected from the office and completed by you and your child's doctor so that we can support your child's needs.

All updated plan must be accompanied by a letter from your doctor and new forms will need to be completed and signed by him/her.

Please keep us up to date. Please also remember that asthma medication and epipens must be replaced prior to expiry also.

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NAIDOC Week Celebrations: In the last week of Term 2, students at Merimbula Public School celebrated NAIDOC week with a variety of activities including a visit to the cultural Centre at Jigamy Farm. An assembly was also held with local community members Mr Graham Moore and Mr Bruce Toomey attending. The 2017 theme - *Our Languages Matter* emphasised and celebrated the unique and essential role that Indigenous languages play in cultural identity, linking people to their land and water and in the transmission of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, spirituality and rites, through story and song.

Our students performed a song and dance to 'Black Fella, White Fella' by the Warumpi Band. Our students also showed an iMovie they had made of the local Dreaming story from the Yuin people of Wallaga Lake, *Bangu*. It explored the importance of belonging and identification. 

Crunch and Sip News:

How can I make fruit and vegetables more appealing to my child? Research has found that children prefer small, cold, crisp, juicy and sweet fruits and colourful, crisp, fresh vegetables. Try the following tips to encourage children to enjoy fruit and vegetables:

- Buy a variety of seasonal fresh fruit so your child doesn't become bored;
- Involve your child in choosing what fruit and vegetables to buy;
- Give them a small, hand-sized piece;
- Cut large fruit and vegetables into small manageable pieces;
- Make 'vegie-people' with your child;
- Freeze small pieces of fruit as an icy snack (try pineapple wedges, orange quarters or grapes).

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Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten) and Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) News:

Welcome back to another wonderful term at Merimbula Public School. We have lots of fun and educational events happening throughout this term and have already been eagerly commencing our teaching and learning programs.

English: In English this term, students will explore imaginative texts and begin to develop their own creative stories. They will engage with the text 'Herb, the Vegetarian Dragon' through Drama and use their creativity to assist them with comprehension and narrative writing. Students will continue with reading in class which will now be supported by the Home Reading program.

Maths: In Mathematics we will be focusing on Whole number, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division, Fractions and Decimals, Patterns and Algebra, 2D Space, 3D Space, Length, Area (Stage 1), Chance (Stage 1), Time (Kindy) Volume and Capacity (Kindy).

Students are encouraged to use Mathletics, an online Maths resource that Merimbula Public School has subscribed to for all students. It is regularly used in group work in class and can also be used at home to supplement learning. Mathletics is designed to be engaging and adaptive for students, with many games and activities across all Mathematics strands. Please contact your class teacher if you need another copy of your child's login detail. Visit www.mathletics.com.au via desktop, iPad or tablet to access.

Unit of Work – Science and Geography: In, K-2 we will be learning all about products and the environment. Students will be exploring and investigating the made environment and a number of products in our local area. The teaching and learning activities provide opportunities for students to explore products and services provided and manufactured in our local environment. The role of the farmer, sustainable farming practices and becoming more environmentally friendly will also be explored. *Excursion*: Students in K-2 will be participating in an excursion to a local farm to learn about life on a farm, as well as the products made in our local environment. A note will be sent home once dates have been confirmed.

Home Reading Program: K-2 have been working towards implementing a Home Reading Program. We would like to thank a number of parents who have assisted in preparing the books for this program. The policy and consent form will be sent home shortly. Please sign the consent form so that your child can participate. Please also provide a plastic envelope folder for the Home Reading Diary and book to go in.

Classroom Supplies: We thank you for supplying your children with all the school supplies that they need within the classroom each day. The beginning of each term is a great time to check that your child has everything they need for the term ahead as many supplies may now be diminishing. Many students require new glue sticks, lead pencils and rubbers.

Spelling Bee: K-2 will be holding a Spelling Bee in Week 5 this term. Classes will hold their own Spelling Bee to select students to compete in the grade Spelling Bee. Spelling lists will be sent home for students who would like additional spelling practise at home.

Class Dojos: Class Dojos are used in the classroom to encourage positive behaviour and to discourage negative behaviour. At this stage, this is used as a classroom tool and has not been extended to inviting parents.

Sport: For Sport this term, students will be focusing on a number of Gymnastics skills including jumping, landing, rolling and rhythm. Sport is held on Wednesday afternoons for all students in K-2.

Waste Free Wednesday: Last term, K-2 aimed to bring in a lunch that was free from waste (or as close as possible) each Wednesday. We are continuing with this initiative again this term in a bid to cut down on packaging and educate students on becoming more environmentally aware. This means that students and parents/carers should aim for no plastic wrap and packaging in lunches, instead using brown paper bags (as they are biodegradable) or place food in plastic containers that can be washed out at home and re-used again.



Science: Stage 2 and 3 students will be focusing on the 'Material World'.

PDHPE: <u>Stage 2</u> will study 'Child Protection' and <u>Stage 3</u> students will study 'Growth and Development' which focuses on: Personal Identity, The Body, Human Sexuality, Changes and Values. 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News From Our Support Classes:

Jigamy Excursion: At the end of Term 2 the support classes attended Jigamy. This excursion was run in conjunction with NAIDOC week and provided the classes with the opportunity to connect with Aboriginal culture and develop their awareness of indigenous practices through a range of activities. Over the course of the day the classes had the opportunity to learn Aboriginal words through story-telling, eat mussels from the fire and take a guided walk to find bush tucker. The classes also enjoyed the opportunity to learn how to throw spears and boomerangs.







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Sensory Garden Learning: The support classes have commenced their project of turning our back play area into a sensory garden. The first phase of the process is moving current plants within the space to a new are so the classes have a blank canvas to work on for their design. This allowed the classes the opportunity to get into the gardens and develop their awareness of planting. Once this has been completed the planning process of the sensory garden will begin and will provide an excellent space during class play times.

Throughout the week the library will display a range of new and award winning children's books. Students will have the opportunity to view the books during their library lesson and also take home a wish list. This can assist parents with birthday, Christmas or gift shopping. Parents/carers also have the opportunity to purchase a book and donate it to the school. Families who donate books will be acknowledged in the book's cover. A percentage of the cost of each book sold will also go to our library to assist us in purchasing great new titles for our children to read.

On the Thursday, August 24, a Book Parade will be held at school. Students, staff, parents and visiting toddlers have the opportunity to dress up and take part in the fun. More information about the event and dress up themes will be sent home in the coming weeks.

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The Jackson Cup: Having emigrated from England in 1951, Mr Percy Jackson's association with Merimbula Public School began after his retirement from a banking career. He lived in nearby Collins Street, and, being a lifetime sports/soccer enthusiast, took an interest in watching the boys play soccer at lunchtime, chatting to the children when they came over. He was invited into the playground and this was when his long association with the school began. From the late 1960's he was a familiar part of the playground scene at lunchtimes. In the cooler months he would be running up and down playing soccer, encouraging and coaching the children. In the warmer months he would be coaching cricket. He was also a regular spectator at weekend club games in these two sports, so he came to know the children very well. (As a matter of fact, he was also a former chairman of soccer and cricket clubs and a founding member Pambula-Merimbula Golf Club). Through Mr Jackson's love of sport the Jackson Cup emerged.

Percy delighted the school community by dressing accordingly in the four different house colours on cup day, including differently coloured, unmatched socks, showing support for ALL the house teams. Although the emphasis of the Jackson Cup has changed a little, from being highly competitive to one of "everyone have a go, and have fun", the spirit of the event - good sportsmanship and participation — remains. To this day it is a very important part of the school's sport program.

All Years 3 to 6 students participate in the Jackson Cup, whether it be in a soccer or netball team to represent their house group (Pelicans – Blue, Swans – Yellow, Kookaburras – Green, Bellbirds – Red). The cup takes place at Berrambool Oval for students Years 3-6 and on the school oval for students in K-2 classes. All students are given a complimentary sausage sandwich and lemonade icy pole on the day. A permission note for the event will be sent home later in the term.
