MESSAGES FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Classes/Staffing: On the last day of 2017, we had enough students to be allocated seventeen mainstream classes/teachers, and 3 support classes. Hence the student classes were sent out on the last day. Historically we have always received an additional 6-20 enrolments on Day 1 of the new year as well. Classes/student numbers appeared stable and unlikely to change.

Over the first three weeks of Term 1, we were given some late notification that some students had enrolled at new schools due to moving house/out of area. We were not notified of many of these moves until we contacted parents/carers a few days into Term 1 (if we could) or until new schools notified us.

Some students also left our mainstream classes as they sought additional support in support classes, which was formally approved by a regional panel. These changes have been beyond the school's control.

As a result, in mid-February when the student number census went in, we had less student enrolments in the mainstream than predicted, and around 10 students had left with only 2 enrolling in the initial weeks. This has resulted in us not being allocated a second

demountable for the 17th class, and us having one teacher/class too many. We are now going to be readjusting some classes for some students. A number of considerations and models were discussed, and shared at last night's P&C Meeting. The model that appeared most beneficial for the most students, and least disruptive due to fewer teacher changes and better teacher consistency has been chosen. From next week our

2K Class <u>will no longer be a class</u>, and the following changes will also occur from Monday:

- 5 of 2K's students will join 2B
- 17 of 2K's students will join 1/2M, with 1/2M becoming a straight year 2
- Of the eleven 1/2M students, two will join 1H, three will join 1S and 6 will join KV
- KV will become K/1V
- 1/2M will become 2M
- Two KV students will join KBC

With the 2K Classroom not being occupied by 2K, Mr Kirk will move into the room with his Year 6 class. With all of Year 6 currently working collaboratively, select students will be moving across with Mr Kirk, from across the three Year 6 classes, so that the students best suited to being in an independent class will be away from their peers.

School News

Look Newsletter Communications: We are currently working on updating our School Stream app and web site for 2018. This week's newsletter also shows our new format. From next week we will again be posting "What's On This Week" messages on Facebook each Monday, as well as informing parents of notes that get sent home through the week on a "Notes" post each Friday. Other updates, pictures and communication will be sent home in our Week 2 and Week 6 Newsletters each term. Updates and changes will be posted on Facebook and important alerts/changes will be shared via the School Stream app.

Allergies and Anaphylaxis Update:

Regulations regarding Anaphylaxis and Allergy Action Plans require all children with mild and severe allergies to have a plan completed and submitted to the school. If you have not informed the school that your child has an allergy/anaphylactic reactions, or your child's information needs updating, please contact the office on 64951266 and request an Action Plan Form to be sent home. Action Plans are required to be updated each year and must be signed off by a doctor.

Emergency Contacts Information Update: We are no longer sending out Emergency Information Update Forms. Instead we ask that you either call the office whenever changes occur (changes to your work, home, mobile numbers & addresses) or come in to the office and fill in a change of information form. It is very important that we have up to date information in the event of an emergency, accident or if staff need to discuss your child's needs with you. Please also ensure that other emergency contacts (ie grandparents, friends who can pick your child up) are also kept up to date.

Discipline Policy and Anti-Bullying Policy: Each year we send home the Anti-Bullying Plan and Discipline Policy for parents to be aware of our rules and procedures in align with Department Policy. We also send home the linked Behaviour Code For Students. The Discipline Policy and Behaviour Code have been sent home with today's Newsletter. The Anti-Bullying Plan will be sent home later in the week once P&C feedback has been received. Please read through them with your child.

Parent-Teacher-Student

Interviews: Thank you to the parents/caregivers who have already returned their booking slip to secure a 3-Way conference during Weeks 6 and 7. If you haven't already sent your slip in, please do so ASAP. Teachers will be sharing information about your child's transition to their new class, progress so far this year as well as working with you and your child to set learning goals for 2018. At the meetings, Kindergarten

parents will also be given information child's their Best Start Assessment results. If you are unable to attend or have a phone interview on your child's designated day, please contact your child's class teacher to arrange a mutually suitable time to meet. Toddlers/siblings are welcome to attend the interviews if you do not have childcare arrangements, however must stay with their parent/carer at all times. In the past we have had to talk to children running around outside, disturbing before/after school care or for playing on unsupervised equipment.

Walking Permission Note: In previous years we have sent home a Walking Permission Note to cover: all walking excursions, shopping activities, Spencer Park visits, Berrambool Visits and other walking activities to some events or locations. Whilst this has been beneficial in saving time for parents, we are no longer able to have one 'blanket note'. Separate notes will be required for all events, activities and times where students are off site. Please support us in getting notes in early for events and excursions. Notes must be in by the due date to ensure a child's participation as we need to legally comply with getting rolls, risk assessments and other organisation in place and communicated to all participating staff prior to an event

Absences: Thank you to everyone for being so prompt in contacting the school in regard to your child's absences. Phone calls on the day of absences are much appreciated (6495 1266), or notes sent in the following day make for less admin follow-up. Blank absence notes have been sent home with this Newsletter. You can also inform the school of your child's absence by completing the "Absentee Form" in the 'Forms' section on our School Stream App. It is a requirement of the Department of Education that all absences are explained. If you have planned absences ie family holidays in school time, please contact the school prior to your departure to apply for an exemption.

School Stream: Our school uses the 'free' School Stream app to communicate events, share some whole school/stage notes electronically (which can be signed on a smart device/phone) and send important alerts. How to get the app on your mobile device:

- Go to the App Store (iPhone/iPad) or Play Store (Android)
- 2. Search for **School Stream** and download the app to your phone
- 3. Make sure you agree to **push notifications**
- 4. Once School Stream has finished installing, open the app, type Merimbula Public School in to the search engine and select our school (or multiple schools if you have children at other schools)
- 5. For more detailed support/instructions, go to: schoolstream.com.au/download

To choose what notifications you receive:

- 1. Open the app on your mobile device
- 2. From the slide-in menu go to settings
- Under Edits/Alerts select My Schools and select your school to open the notifications page
- 4. Toggle notifications on/off according to the ones you want (PLEASE KEEP THE ALERTS AS NOTIFICATIONS AS THIS WILL BE USED IN THE EVENT OF EVACUATIONS/EMERGENCIES and important last minute reminders etc)
- 5. Jump between your child's schools by touching the school logo in the top blue bar.

Clean Up Australia Day: Thank you to all students at Merimbula Public School who participated in the 28th Clean Up Australia Day event last Friday at school. We have participated in this community event for many years. Students were proud to support the local area, cleaning up Spencer Park, Berrambool Oval, Munn and Randolf Street and the school grounds. Thank you to the parents/carers who sent in nondisposable garden gloves for their child to use, and to all for talking to their child about safety prior to the event.

Voluntary School Contributions:

Thank you to the eager families who have already contacted us about paying 'school fees'. Whilst our school, as with other public primary schools in NSW, does not have fees, parents/carers are invited to pay a 'voluntary school contribution'. We have kept our contribution down to \$45 for the school year per child once again. Invoices have been sent home as a reminder of the contribution costs. If you would like to support us in purchasing additional resources for classrooms and the playground, please forward payment by the end of Term 1 via the payment box in the office or via the 'Make A Payment' tab on our web site.

Bus and Bus Stop Safety: Unfortunately it has been brought to our attention by community members that a number of students have been seen crossing roads unsafely, usually when getting out of their parents' car, at bus stops. Some students have also been seen to cross roads and play too closely to them at/around bus stops. Please talk to your child about bus stop and travel safety to support the school in reminding your child about safe travel practices.

Anti-Racism Contact Officer: Our school's Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO) is Mrs Janelle Hodsdon. If you are aware of any issues regarding racism, please inform Mrs Hodsdon so that she can follow-up with education and support for all involved.

Tell Them From Me Survey: In Term 1 our school is taking part in the Tell Them From Me student survey (for Years 4 to 6 students). The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life and how engaged they are with the different ways that teachers interact with them. The survey is completed online by an independent research company. More information about the survey has been sent home with Years 4-6 students today. If you do not want yoru child to participate in the survey, please return the appropriate 'opt out' note.

Week 11 End Of Term Celebration Discos: At the end of this term, students who are not on Behaviour Monitoring, and who have not been suspended, will be invited to attend the End Of Term Disco. The discos will be a little different than in the past. We are trialling having the discos at lunch time and reducing the cost (less cost and more family time for families). Students taking part will not require a permission note. They can

pay their \$2 entry fee (saving \$5 from last year's cost) on their way into the hall (saving families and our administration staff/teachers lots of time processing payments!). Kids can pay on the day, so there are no issues with having to pay earlier if your child has been away or has previously been on monitoring. Our SRC will run the disco, coordinate the music play list and your children will not get chip bags (supporting our new canteen policy) as the disco will take place after their usual eating time when they have finished their lunch. Disco days are *April* 10 K-2 & April 12 Years 3-6.

Stage 3 News

Homework: Stage 3 students have been set a homework task to help them prepare for High School. The task is related to multiplication facts. We are encouraging all students to set time aside each day (at home) to complete this task. If you or your child has any questions or concerns it is important that you see their class teacher.

Year 5 and 6 Camps: Year 5 students will be given the opportunity to go on a sports and recreation camp to Jindabyne during Term 4. Stage 2 News

In Stage 2 we have had a great start to the year and have been quickly and eagerly commencing our teaching and learning programs for Term 1.

English: Stage 2 have begun setting up Writing Workshops and exploring 'seeds' which act as a stimulus for writing. Many students have brought in a seed from home and have begun using this for their writing.

Students are also encouraged to bring in a book of their own choice to use during our Literacy time. Please assist your child in choosing a book that is suitable. Your child's class teacher will be able to support you in this should you have any questions.

We have also begun using the English Stars program which explores the language, literature and literacy components of the Australian Curriculum. Students have their own login and passwords and this program is used in class during literacy.

Soundwaves: Stage 2 students have been using the Sound Waves program for Spelling. This program uses a phonemic approach towards spelling and is being used across the school. Students can access this at home at www.soundwaveskids.com.au.

The access code for Year 3 is bang336 and for Year 4 is class428.

iMaths: In Mathematics we have been using the iMaths program which integrates Maths Investigations. The iMaths program is accessible at home at www.imathskids.com.au.

The access code for Year 3 is rich8o9 and Year 4 is love795.

AFL Gala Day: Stage 2 will be attending the Auskick Gala Day at Pambula on Thursday March 17. This is a great opportunity for students to develop their coordination, catching, throwing and kicking skills. We are excited for a fun day!

Excursion to Bournda: Stage 2 students will be participating in an excursion to Bournda Environmental Education Centre on Monday March 26. This complements our Science and Geography conceptual inquiry unit about Interrelationships and Sustainability. A note has been sent home separately.

Waste Free Wednesday: To complement our unit, every Wednesday students will aim to bring in a lunch that is free from waste (or as close as possible). This means that students and parents/carers should aim for no plastic wrap and packaging in lunches, instead using brown paper bags (as they are biodegradable) or place food in plastic containers that can be washed out at home and re-used again.

In addition, we have placed some additional bins in the playground to put in any food scraps which will be used for compost. Tubs have also been placed to collect used bottles and cartons which will be taken to collection points and 10c per bottle/carton redeemed. Money raised will be given back to the canteen.

Boomerang Bags Talk: complement our Inquiry unit about Interrelationships and Sustainability, a representative from Boomerang Bags will be talking to Stage 2 students on Monday March 19. Boomerang Bags works to reduce the use of plastic bags by engaging local communities in the making of Boomerang Bags – community recycled made, using materials. Boomerang Bags provide a free, fun, sustainable alternative to plastic bags. We will be inviting volunteers (who have a sewing machine), to come into our Stage 2 classrooms to assist us with making re-usable bags in the weeks following the talk. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you are able to assist.

Home Reading: Home Reading has commenced for the year and students in Stage 2 are invited to participate. This is not compulsory, but is a great opportunity for students to practise their reading skills at home and is aimed at

encouraging a love and enthusiasm for reading. Students may choose to use books from our school home reading program, or may read chosen books from the library or books they have at home.

Support Class News

Garden Experts: Our Support Class students have continued to care for our school garden and chickens this term. In the coming weeks they are looking forward to sharing their knowledge of garden and life skills with other classes in the school, who will be taking over some of the roles as part of their science units of work.
