Request For Student To Carry Their Own Adrenaline



Injector or Asthma Reliever: For some medications and some students, it can be appropriate for them to carry their own medication to school and at school, for example, an adrenaline injector for anaphylaxis and asthma reliever medication for asthma. For asthma and anaphylaxis it is important for students to have immediate access to their medication.

Please consider whether your child should carry their own adrenaline injector or asthma reliever medication to school and while they are at school. Should they be required to do so, a new form (from the Department of Education) must be completed by parents/caregivers. If you have already completed a similar form in the past, the school will be providing you with the updated form. If your child has asthma, anaphylaxis or the need to carry other medications, and they do not have a form lodged with the school/Department, please request one ASAP. These will also be accompanied by an 'Authorisation to Contact (your child's) Doctor'.

On receiving this completed request form, the school will confirm the arrangements for how and where your child will carry their own medication. Parents must vlagus an asthma reliever or at least one prescribed adrenaline to school. This injector the adrenaline injector must be either carried by the student held by the school. Please note that this form is not a substitute for the ASCIA Action Plan for **Anaphylaxis** or the Asthma Action Plan signed by the student's doctor.

2025 Kindergarten Enrolments - NOW DUE: Parents/carers of children commencing school in 2025 are encouraged to complete an online enrolment as soon as possible, to ensure that we have adequate staffing and classrooms for what is predicted to be another large cohort of students. We do not have two full Year 6 classes this year, and expect to have 3 or 4 Kindergarten classes, so are likely to need another demountable classroom for the new year.

# Attendance **Expectations:**

Students are expected to attend school each day, unless they are unwell



or have permission for leave from the Principal (for an extended absence). It is the responsibility of schools to support parents/carers by monitoring student attendance and helping to address attendance issues when they emerge.

Attendance letters are sent home: when students have unexplained absences, to students who are frequently late or who have more than a 10% absence rate (having 1 or more days off school a fortnight).

Continued absences, following an absence reminder letter, may result in a child requiring a medical certificate for future absences. Subsequent letters result in referral to the Home School Liaison Officer. Should these interventions fail, applications to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order will be made by a member of the regional attendance team.

#### **Kindergarten News:**

Welcome back to Term 3. We cannot believe we have celebrated being at school for 100 days already and we look forward to sharing your childs' learning and achievements with you at our 3 way conferences.

During our literacy sessions we will be continuing with our InitiaLit lessons focusing on learning new sounds and characters this term, as well as, learning to read our 'Tricky words' which you can find in your child's Home Reading diary. For writing this term we will be looking at 'Fairy Tales' and are planning a Fairy Tale ball to bring the unit to an end towards the end of the term so watch this space!

To align with our Fairy Tale ball, our PE unit this term will be a dance unit, teaching our students some dances they will use at the ball. In sport, we will be playing invasion games to allow children to use the fundamental movement skills they will be practising during PE sessions in a game situation.

During Mathematics, we will be looking at the following 'big ideas' over the term:

- Collections of 10 are really useful
- Patterns have something that repeats over and over and over
- Making and using equal groups
- What needs to be measured determines the unit of measurement and
- A fraction (like one half) can mean half of a collection, half of an object or half of a measure. A whole unit can be partitioned into smaller parts.

Our PDH unit will be around safe and unsafe feelings and how to keep ourselves safe.

In Creative and Performing Arts, all classes will continue to learn songs and dances for this year's upcoming musical, "Annie". They will also be making art works and props for this production.

Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2 News): Welcome to Term 3. We are now halfway through the year and we look forward to discussing your child's progress with you at our upcoming 3 Way Conferences. Year 1 will be taking part in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check this term, along with all Year 1 students in NSW. Below is an outline of this term. Please take the time to read it so that you can support your child. We look forward to some great learning opportunities and fun times.

We will continue to follow the InitiaLit program in English in both Year 1 and Year 2. The Term 3 Home Reading Diary will be sent home in your child's home reading folder early this term. We will also be adding the next set of Tricky Words so that children can practise them at home. In writing, we will continue to explore how to create written texts by studying rich literature picture books and learning the components of perspective and argument; narrative; context; representation; imagery, symbol and connotation.

In Mathematics, Year 1 will focus on whole numbers, mass, addition and subtraction, 2D shapes, multiplication







and division and Time. Year 2 will be studying whole numbers; 3D objects; addition and subtraction; time; mass and multiplication and division. Children will continue working on their Maths Passports. Teachers will set Mathseeds tasks so that children can revise concepts learnt in class at home. If you require your child's password to be reissued, please contact your child's teacher.

Our Conceptual Unit will focus on Geography, specifically Australian places and our location in the world. We are hoping to attend an excursion to Bournda Outdoor Environmental Education Centre to support our learning in this area.

In PDHPE, children will continue to develop their fundamental movement skills such as throwing and catching, with the aim of using these during Sport time. Children will participate in a health unit called Food Safari. They will learn about the links between health and physical activity and be encouraged to make healthy and safe choices for their wellbeing.

In Creative and Performing Arts, all classes will continue to learn songs and dances for this year's upcoming musical, "Annie". They will also be making art works and props for this production.

In sport, we will be playing invasion games to allow children to use the fundamental movement skills they will be practising during PE sessions in a game situation.

Vanessa Bain – Stage 1 Assistant Principal Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) News: Welcome back to our Stage 2 families for Term 3, 2024.

Sport and PE: Stage 2 Sport will continue to take place on a Friday (12.15pm to 1.15pm and 1.55pm-2.55pm) in Term 3. Please ensure your children have comfortable joggers to wear, a hat and extra water for the day. Sunscreen will be available. This term in Physical Education, we will be focussing on game sports and athletic skills in preparation for our Jackson Cup. However, from Weeks 6-9, students will be participating in the Elective Sports program on a Thursday. More information regarding this has been shared via Compass.

<u>English:</u> Stage 2 will be continuing their novel studies as well as a poetry focus.

<u>Year 3 Text Study:</u> Students will be studying The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, and will include an Informative writing focus.

<u>Year 4 Text Study:</u> Students will be studying Storm Boy by Colin Thiele, and will also include an informative writing focus.

<u>Spelling and Grammar:</u> Will continue to be supported by the Soundwaves program.

Year 3 and 4 Mathematics: Lessons will be focussing on place value to order, read and represent numbers including decimals; Mental and written strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems including money. The use of simple maps and grids to represent position; Mass; Angles and Chance events.







<u>Conceptual Unit:</u> Our Conceptual Unit reading strategies, vocabulary and will incorporate all Key Learning Areas sentence structure.

Conceptual Unit: Within our conceptual unit Changes, students will explore the impact bushfires have on Australian people, places and environments, and will propose ways people can reduce the impact of bushfires in the future. During the unit, students will undertake art activities based upon learning tasks they encounter.


Mathematics: In Mathematics, students will focus on the strands of representing numbers using place value; additive relations, multiplicative relations; representing quantity fractions; two and three dimensional spatial structures, geometric and non spatial measurement; chance and data.

Personal Development and Health: In PDH, students will explore the topic of 'Why is it important to be fit and healthy?'. They will examine the role of physical activity in promoting health and wellbeing.

Physical Education and Sport: During PE, students will learn the skills, technique and rules to participate in the Jackson Cup sports in Term 4, which will be soccer and netball. They will also engage in tennis and tee-ball where they will focus on striking, throwing and catching. In Weeks 6-9 will also students have the opportunity to participate in Elective Sports, where they will select from provided sports they wish to explore.

In Creative and Performing Art, all classes will continue to learn songs and dances for this year's upcoming musical, "Annie". They will also be making art works and props for this production.

# Henwood Street Drop Off Zone/Back Gate Access UPDATE:

The Henwood Street back gate has reopened for pick up and drop off this Term between 8.30am and 8.55am; and between 2.55pm and 3.10pm - please note that access outside of these times must be from the front office gate on Randolph Street, unless accessing Aspire OSHC from their gate. Please ensure your child exits and enters your vehicle from the path/curb on the side of the road closest to the school oval, when your car is stopped. Please ensure that you take note of the new parking signs.

There are "No Parking" signs and requirements on the school side of Henwood Street, with new curb and guttering to assist safer drop off and pick up access.

There are also "No Stopping" signs on Henwood Street opposite the school side.

#### What are the rules?

No parking: You must not stop or park your vehicle:

- alongside another parked vehicle (double park);
- across a driveway, unless you're picking up or dropping off passengers;
- on a median strip, unless a sign says you can;
- on a traffic island:
- on a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing;
- on footpaths and nature strips,

- unless a sign says you can; in a slip lane, unless a sign says you can.
- Your parked vehicle must not block the flow of traffic or become a danger to other road users.
- In some places, you must not park at certain times or under certain conditions.
- If you have a Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) permit, you can stop for up to 5 minutes.

#### 'No parking' signs:

- You must not park on a road or in an area where there's a 'No parking' sign. This may be all the time or at certain times, as shown on the sign.
- You can stop for less than 2 minutes if you stay within 3m of your vehicle, if you're:
- dropping off or picking up passengers;
- loading or unloading items.

#### No stopping:

- The 'No stopping' sign means you must not stop at any point on the road or kerb in the direction of the arrow, unless in an emergency.
- 'No stopping' areas are sometimes marked by an unbroken yellow edge line.
- Restrictions may apply at certain times only, as shown on the sign.

#### Vehicle parking rules:

 You must not park within 1m of another vehicle parked in front or behind (but not when angle parking).
