The **PSSA District Rugby League Trials** will be held at **Bill Smyth Oval, Narooma, onFriday, April 1** (next week – **Week 10**).

- The U11's Trials will be held from 9.30am to 11.30am.
- The Open (12's and 13's Trials) will be held between 12pm and 2pm.

The South Coast Convenor, Mr Paul Sweeney (Narooma PS Principal) is calling for expressions of interest for **TALENTED** Rugby League players at our school to trial for the opportunity for a position in the Far South Coast PSSA team. **Children selected in this team will be required to play at the South Coast Trials in Batemans Bay on Friday April 29 2022.**

Students attending these trials must have prior approval from their school Principal. Transport to/from the venue is the responsibility of the parent/caregiver. Please ensure all children are at the ground at least 30 minutes prior to their age group time.

All children need to bring <u>a jersey with a number, shorts, socks, boots, mouthguard and adrink bottle</u>. **These** are essential for children to trial on the day. If your child needs to borrow a school jersey with a number, they can come and see me and borrow one until after the trials.

South Coast PSSA need to ensure that the trials are COVID safe! This means parents/caregivers will be asked to remain outside the fence and ensure social distancing measures are in place.
