Dear Parents/Carers,

Your child has been selected to participate in the Far South Coast Touch Football trials to be held at **Pambula Sporting Complex**, **Pambula Beach on Friday 25th of February**, **2022**. This session will commence at **12pm and conclude by 2pm**. If successful at these trials, your child will then represent the Far South Coast Touch Football team and participate in further selection trials in **Wollongong on 7th March**, **2022 for the girls team** and **8th March**, **2022 for the boys team**. At this event a South Coast team will be selected to compete at the NSW PSSA Touch Football Championships.

Transport to all venues and training is the responsibility of participants. These are significant commitments.

These trials are not participation based. Only competitive touch football players of representative potential are encouraged to attend. Please be aware of COVID-19 restrictions during these trials; Students are asked to take a Rapid Antigen Test on the morning of the trial and not attend if they have a positive result. Students should also not attend if they have any cold or flu like symptoms. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, parents/carers are asked to stay off the field and behind the fence and socially distance. COVID Safe measures in place during the trials include: separation of students into school cohorts where possible, modified activities to reduce mingling and additional sanitation measures.

Students should NOT attend the trials unless they are committed to go to Wollongong, and if selected there, attend several training sessions throughout the year.

Transport to these trials at Pambula will be provided by parents/carers.
